### News from the Board – January meeting:

The Board approved 2009 sponsorship of Boy Scout Troop 255. The Sailing Committee proposed that the club purchase boats needed for the youth sailing program; the board approved the idea in concept, and asked for the scope of the 2009 youth sailing classes to understand the finances. We reviewed the monthly financial summary, and will collect some additional data to finalize the 2009 budget at the February meeting. We are working on our ABC license for the new building and submitting 2009 directors to ABC. The Board approved a hospitality credit for member guest chefs.

We discussed details of the new building and financing. The spending rate matches the expected Phase I completion. Bjorn summarized work needed in the boatyard before final inspection of the new building. He requested board and member help to manage boatyard work. We are looking for places to move the boats during final grading, and will have multiple work parties to clean the yard. Our floating docks were split to survive winter storms.




## Building Update

### Phase 1 (occupancy) Progress to Date

Last month the county building department stopped our inspections while they re-reviewed our roof truss design. That exercise and the rain, and some vacation, created a cumulative delay of 2 weeks to the expansion timeline.

**Progress:** The windows are in, the roof is on. The forced hot air ducting is in. The fire sprinkler system is in. The restroom framing is up. Most of the wiring (electrical, sound, and cable) is in place. The north wall has its exterior planking (Hardy). The fire door is in.



### Building Committee Actions

The committee sampled opinions from members on the quality of the restroom fixtures and found that feedback was positive supporting “better” but not excessive. The committee has received a steady stream of comments and ideas from the membership and it is all considered within the time available on our contractor’s schedule.

Based on the input, the building committee has made choices required to complete phase 1. Specifically:

- Tankless hot water heater for energy efficiency
- Fiberglass exterior doors and solid wood interior doors for durability
- Tile floor in restrooms & showers to survive an accidental overflow and provide abrasion resistance to sand
- Upgraded all 3 shower bases for ease of cleaning and durability
- Sunlight pipes to provide natural light in the two windowless restrooms
- Sound dampening sheetrock and low noise ventilation fans in the restrooms to provide a quiet experience
- Upgraded commercial toilets (hi flow) with soft drop lids
- Matched sets of commercial quality ADA fixtures in all of the restrooms and showers.
- Custom side cabinets in the standard restrooms, which are small and would not accommodate off the shelf cabinets

### Estimated Completion Date


The final inspection is targeted for mid March. However we will have a flurry of activity right before the inspection. The boat yard will be cleared of all boats and a large grader will arrive and move the ground around to create proper drainage. We get the final inspection and move the boats back.

### Budget

We continue to be on track for a phase 1 cost of approximately \$403,000. There is a cost saving opportunity if members assist the sheet rock installation (coming soon). We have already received a \$776 discount for member donated labor.

### Main Room Floor may be in Phase 1

With extra time before completion, (and urging from a few members), the committee has decided to try to put the final floor in. This will require us to resolve the options and get member input before making the purchase. We have been researching flooring for some time and best choice appears to be commercial vinyl. Stone is first in abrasion but it was judged too expensive, cold, and hard for the main room. Vinyl has an attractive finish and is the second best for resistant to abrasion (sand), and water damage and best for maintenance cost. See the gray wood grain flooring in Safeway for an example of this type of flooring, but not the color. We will put the word out when we have narrowed the options and the membership can make the final selection.

## Boatyard Poll

The following is repeated from the January AHOY! because we continue to seek your input on the post-construction boatyard plan. Please respond directly to Jenna Kinghorn [tydpoolz@comcast.net](mailto:tydpoolz@comcast.net) if you:

- Would like to keep one or more kayaks on an open-air rack (current rate is \$15/month, billed quarterly)
- Would like to keep one or more kayaks in a covered rack (rate TBD, probably ~\$30/month)
- Would like to keep a rack-storable windsurfer or similar craft on an open-air rack (rate TBD, ~\$20/month)
- Would like to keep a boat on a trailer (current rate is \$2.25/foot/month, billed quarterly)
- Would like to keep another form of watercraft (please give me a brief description, including dimensions and whether it is light enough to store on a rack) in the boatyard
- Don't want to keep my boat at HMBYC long-term, but would like to be able to leave it locked up in the yard in an "overnight storage" area a few times a year while taking part in a regatta or other multi-day event (please give me a brief description, including rough dimensions and whether it is light enough to store on a rack)

Medical Emergencies**

What would you do if, say, during a HMBYC function a fellow member experienced a heart attack, stroke or other problem? A medical emergency can happen anywhere, anytime. This is the second in a series of articles that will focus on the nature of the emergency and what you can do to help

***A Stroke Doesn't Have to Leave Its Victim Permanently Disabled***

**What is a stroke?**

- A stroke occurs when a blood vessel bringing oxygen to the brain gets blocked or ruptured.
- Deprived of oxygen, nerve cells can't function and they begin to die. When nerve cells don't function, the part of the body they control can't function, either.
- Stroke is the No. 3 cause of death and a leading cause of serious, long-term disability in the U.S.

**Symptoms**

These are the most common stroke symptoms:

- Severe headache
- Difficulty walking
- Speech slurred or face droopy
- One side of the body becomes weak or numb
- Vision may become blurry or impaired

As soon as you feel these symptoms or detect them in someone else, ***prompt medical attention is crucial.***

There is a window of opportunity in which the application of clot busting drugs can prevent serious or long-term disability. That window lasts approximately **three hours**. After that, it might be too late to mitigate the impact of a stroke. An untreated stroke can cause not only disability, but in some cases, death. **Call 911 immediately.** Make sure the EMTs know it's a stroke and not something else. **Minutes matter.**

USCG reminds you that older EPIRBs that broadcast analog signals on the 121.5 or 243 MHz frequencies will not be monitored by satellites as of February 1. Mariners should be using EPIRBs that transmit on 406 MHz frequency.

Strictly Sail Pacific returns to Oakland's Jack London Square from Wednesday, April 15 to Sunday, April 19. This is the largest sail-only boat show on the West Coast with over 100 boats and 250 booths. Adults \$12 on weekdays, \$15 on weekend. Children 15 and younger get in free.


Periodically I will put a column in AHOY! to keep you informed of the happenings behind the bar. Feel free to let me know your thoughts or concerns.

You may have noticed a different pinot grigio in our refrigerator. Our distributor offered us Torre Rosazza at the same price as the old brand. This is a wine that normally would be too expensive for us, but we have 2 cases that we can sell at the same \$4 per glass.

Villa Maria sauvignon blanc was a very popular wine for a number of months but really fell off this past summer. As we already carry the much-in-demand Kendall-Jackson sauvignon blanc at \$4 and the Murphy-Goode fume also at \$4, we are discontinuing the Villa Maria.

Fosters beer was also more popular when we first carried it, but it too lost its audience. We do have a lager in a bottle, the St. Pauli Girl. Meanwhile, we had a tap open and I have brought back Mavericks ale. Hopefully the membership will enjoy this beer.

I know how frustrating the beer gas lines have been. I am so grateful (and I'm sure the membership is, too) to Jeff Hume and Larry Miller for discovering the THREE leaks in the lines that service the beer taps and fixing them. They and I feel confident that the problem has been solved and we should not be running out of gas anymore. I have returned the gas canisters we borrowed from the American Legion and Miramar Beach Restaurant with a note expressing our thanks for their help and support.
