## HMBYC Member Boat Takes Admiral's Cup in Lipton Series

The Pacific Interclub Yacht Association (PICYA) hosted the Lipton Cup series the weekend of July 18 & 19 on the San Francisco cityfront with trophies in four one-design classes. Olson-25's were selected to compete for the Admiral's Cup and Valhalla Cup (second place) perpetual trophies. Terri Lahey and Steve Smith's Olson-25 *Synchronicity* represented HMBYC with Karen Flick as tactician. As usual, there was lots of wind and lots of chop, plus flukey conditions at the weather mark. The first two races were decided by proper choice of which side of the course on the run, with *Samba* (Encinal YC) winning by going furthest out on the first race and *Shark on Bluegrass* (Berkeley YC) going furthest in on the second to win, overlapped with *Synchronicity* at the finish. After two races only 2 points separated *Synchronicity*, in the lead, from the 4th-place boat. The finish order for the final race was established on the first weather leg, though it was exciting for the remaining four legs. Approaching the final leeward mark a few boatlengths behind *Samba*, *Synchronicity* was faced with J-105's coming off their starting line for the Albert Simpson Regatta. *Samba* rounded just ahead of the J's, while we had to drop the spinnaker early to squeeze between two J's, turn hard behind them, and round the mark. We lost a little distance to *Samba*, but held our position to finish the race second, earning us first place for the regatta and the right to keep the Admiral's Cup Trophy at the HMBYC clubhouse until we defend it next year.

## FROM THE BOATYARD

Many thanks to all who have helped get the yard back into action since the new building was completed. A special thanks to Jenna Kinghorn for all her work as previous yard manager. There are some things everyone needs to be aware of. Most importantly, the Fire Lanes. The gate on Princeton labeled “Tow Away” is in fact a *Fire Lane*. Please do not ever block this gate. The open pathways in the yard are for Fire Department access and may not be blocked. If, for example, you leave your car in the Fire Lane and go sailing, your car can be towed at your expense. The Fire Department and the Club take the department’s access to our property very seriously.

Please do not leave anything on the ground. Items left on the ground will be disposed of. Also, please put things back where you found them. Keep in mind that if a spot is empty, it belongs to someone, so don’t assume it is available. We need to make sure our tenants (most of whom are members) have full access to the yard and their boats. If you want to move to another space please call me first so I can make sure that space is available and not assigned to someone else.

The yard is a work in progress. The sailing folks are working on their container which will help in keeping the yard in good shape. New aluminum tags are being attached to boats with the owner’s name on them. The carabineers holding them in place can be easily removed when the boat is taken out.

## An Invitation to Guest Chefs

Does the idea of cooking for 30 to 40 of your fellow HMBYC members sound intriguing? Then you might be just the person Events Chair Cynthia Ramseyer is looking for.

Hello Chefs Supreme! We have seven Social Saturday Night Dinners coming up this autumn and winter and I am hoping one of the dates below will appeal to your culinary efforts on behalf of your hungry fellow Club members and that you will sign up to be a Guest Chef.

The general guideline for Social Saturday dinners is to prepare for 30-40 people, although we have been seeing those numbers increase, and once we are able to use our new Club House for dining, we may see more people attending. We have made a practice of reimbursing Guest Chefs up to \$150 (receipts need to be submitted and signed off by a Board member). However, we may find that with increased numbers of diners, we may need to rethink reimbursement caps. The bottom line is that the dinner should pay for itself and make some money for the Club's coffers.

There are a couple pieces of really good news for Guest Chefs: (1) Events Committee is recommending that a bartender be hired for Social Saturdays to help take the pressure off the Watch Officer. (2) The kitchen has been expanded by 6 feet, has more prep space, and everything in the kitchen has been thoroughly cleaned. (3) The new two-oven, 6-burner stove is installed and functions very well. The ovens come up to temperature quickly and accurately, and the new stove has a 24" square griddle as well as a salamander (cheese melter *cum* broiler). (4) We have Jacob on Saturday evenings to bus tables and wash dishes and pots and pans to take some of the load off our volunteer hospitality help. (5) As Commander-in-Chef, only those people you invite to help you in the kitchen will be there. You, and you alone, control your menu, kitchen and crew when you choose to cook. What's not to like?

I look forward to hearing from you and sincerely hope you will cook for the Club over the next few months. Everyone enjoys these dinners, and your help would be most appreciated!
