

Pillar Point's Pelicans with Deborah Jaques Friday August 5th @ 6:30pm at the HMBYC





Hear stories from thirty years of studying brown pelicans, including fascinating glimpses of what electronic tracking technology used on the Refugio Oil Spill pelicans is teaching us. Nearly 20 of the Refugio birds have been seen in Pillar Point harbor.

Meet(virtually) a few of California's most notable pelicans- the famous K15, who often split his time between the harbor and Pacifica Pier, as well as C84 and Z15, who are both currently spending a lot of time on the breakwater.

Deborah Jaques is an Astoria, Oregon based biologist. Applied seabird research projects have taken her from the Antarctic to the Olympic Peninsula; the California brown pelican has been a focus of her conservation efforts for more than 30 years. Deborah did graduate research at U.C. Davis on pelican habitat, including an evaluation of oceanographic influences on Northern range expansion and use of communal roost sites. Her recent work in California has been on pelican recovery from last May's Refugio Beach oil spill in Santa Barbara.

Aside from the usual regatta-management tasks, there were eight (yes, 8!) separate incidents requiring safety boat response:

- 2 capsizes, one with lost rudder
- 2 drifted-out-of-position marks
- A crew member overboard

- A Cal 20 with broken spreader
- A missing offset pin
- A pair of exhausted kayakers

The kayakers were not part of the regatta, of course, but they were also the closest thing to a true "rescue" of the day—they were lucky that we were out there.

PLEASE WEAR YOUR MEMBER BADGE WHILE AT THE CLUB so the instructors know at a glance that you're allowed to be there. If you forget, please don't be offended if an instructor asks you to identify yourself. (Exception: if you're working in the boatyard, especially with power equipment, please do not wear anything around your neck, even your badge. We want you to stay safe too!)

With the coming of summer, we've seen a lot more kids at the club. Unfortunately, we have also seen a lot of unsafe behavior just in the past few weekends, both on the water and in the clubhouse/event center. We are proud to be a child-friendly club, but we do require that children conduct themselves in ways consistent with club policies on safety and appropriate behavior. While on club premises, children must be directly supervised by a parent or guardian.

We are especially strict about boating and water safety precautions. Any minor going past the upper end of the boat ramp is **required** to wear an approved PFD. Also, please understand that the ferry is **not** a toy or a swim platform, and children are not allowed to operate it without an adult present on the ferry itself. Nor are children allowed on the dock unescorted. Likewise, boats and watercraft—including SUP's and kayaks—are not for use by children except under the direct supervision of a responsible adult.

We also need your help to keep the club clean. Please have your child rinse off their sandy or muddy feet **before** entering the clubhouse or the event center, and use the outdoor shower to rinse off sand before heading in to the regular showers.

Watch officers and dockmasters are authorized to intercede if they see minors behaving unsafely or endangering other members or club property; please don't be offended if one of them needs to talk to you or your child. By following the commonsense rules, we keep the club safe, and our fleet available, for all members. Thanks!
