# Note From The Rear Commodore Jebruary 2018

## MANAGEMENT OF CHECKED-OUT SKIPPERS, Sunday Skippers, and Examiners

We have instituted new procedures to manage and administer the overall programs of getting people checked-out to sail the club boats (Cal 20's, Lasers, and C 15's) and to schedule Sunday Skippers. We are trying to make getting checked out on all 3 classes easier and more clearly defined, and trying to make it so that there will be Sunday Skippers available every week to take people sailing on Cal 20's as per the sailing calendar. The new procedures are accomplished by putting someone in charge of managing and administering the process of checking people out, and scheduling Sunday Skippers, a role we are calling *Skipper Lead*. Also, this role will include updating the examiners list, and reviewing binders with checked out skipper tests. I am pleased that *Peggy Ruse* has accepted this important new staff position. Over the next few months she will be reviewing our procedures, with the help of the Sailing Committee, and modifying as necessary. And she will be getting a handle on the list (or lists, which is part of the problem) of who is checked out already, and to ensure the list is up-to-date and that all the people on it are indeed currently knowledgable enough and active to take club boats out.



## HMBYC Youth Sailing Recognized As **Best** Youth Sailing Program On The West Coast



Following up on having won the Admiral Chester W. Nimitz Trophy last fall from PICYA, as the best youth sailing program in the Bay Area, last month *HMBYC Youth Sailing was also awarded the Garrett Horder Memorial Trophy from PCYA, as the best youth sailing program on the entire west coast!* PCYA, the Pacific Coast Yachting Association, represents clubs and associations from Vancouver to San Diego, plus Hawai'i. We have always been proud of our youth program, but it is delightful to have our success recognized externally.

The permanent trophy, a famous Currier and Ives print of the sail/steam vessel "San Francisco", is over one hundred years old and occupies a prominent location in the library of the St. Francis Yacht Club. There is also a "take-home" plaque which will be proudly displayed at the club.

## From the Membership Committee Survey Results

Thanks to all who responded to the Member Survey. We had 143 returns! The report provided at the Quarterly Membership Meeting on January 28 will be published on-line on the HMBYC website but here's a snapshot.

#### Typical HMBYC membership is for:

- Male/Female couple
- 55-64 years old
- Employed full time
- Have been a club member for 2-5 years
- 20% of the members surveyed have children
- 35% have a dog that they bring to the club

#### Q: Do you come to the club mainly to sail or socialize? Answer: Yes!

We learned a lot from respondents about the value of the two main activities of the club, sailing and socializing (the bar) and it's helping us to work on more opportunities and activities to appeal to each interest. You'll notice a new calendar posted in the bar area by the kitchen. We'll color code sailing activities in blue and green and social activities in orange so that you (and potential members) can see "at a glance" the mix of sailing and social activities for the year.

The Events Committee has received the information about what possible future activities or events are desired. The information included what is of most interest during the winter months. Wine tasting and talks on local marine mammals scored highest interest overall and educational lectures and more social events for winter time. We are indeed a diverse group!

We got terrific feedback on what physical improvements overall are desired. This will better inform expenditure priorities. The deck, deck tables, new picnic tables, the outdoor lighting ranked as top four responses for improvement.

#### How likely are you to recommend the Yacht Club to a friend?

We are thrilled to see that 64% of 143 respondents responded with a 10 out of 10. That means your Membership Committee is deeply interested in the 36% who want to assist us with making it a 10. The comments provided wonderful insight and there's more to be revealed ahead to understand what we need to do and in what order.

Lots to learn about different kinds of buoys, how to determine the latitude and longitude of buoys, how to figure the true north course and magnetic north course between buoys and how to log all this information. Still plenty to learn and practice but she had our rapt attention for three hours.



# WINTER SAILING

Even though it is now officially winter, and you may prefer some days to stay by your fire with a hot chocolate (or other beverage of choice) in your hand, some days are pleasant enough to go sailing. And your Yacht Club can accommodate your needs on these days. Most of the Cal 20's are on the hard for the winter, but two — Mercury and Venus — are kept in the water all winter long, and are available to any checked-out skipper. They are in the Pillar Point inner harbor, slip C21.

There are several differences between winter and summer sailing, so you need to be aware of our winter sailing procedures.

or




You take 1 Watch Officer shift a month in 2017: <sup>\$</sup>25 x 12 – <sup>\$</sup>300 off your annual dues
