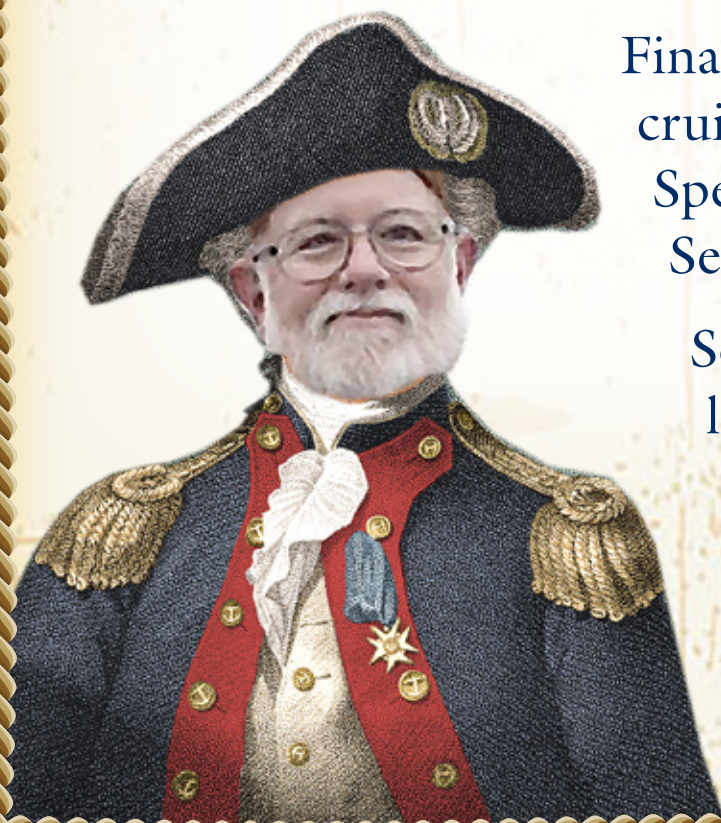

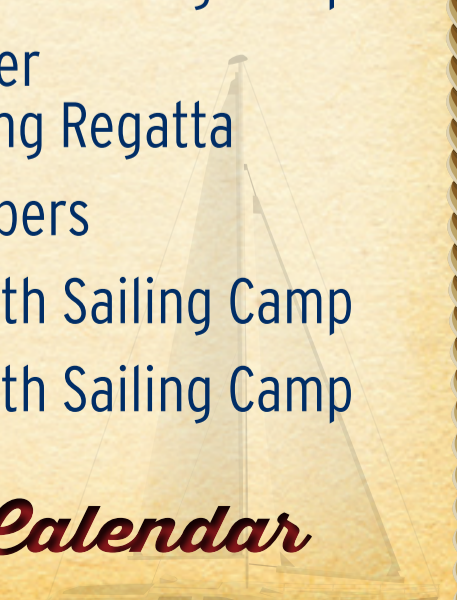

- ◆ Honor Bar, where an Active Watch Officer may open bar outside of normal club hours

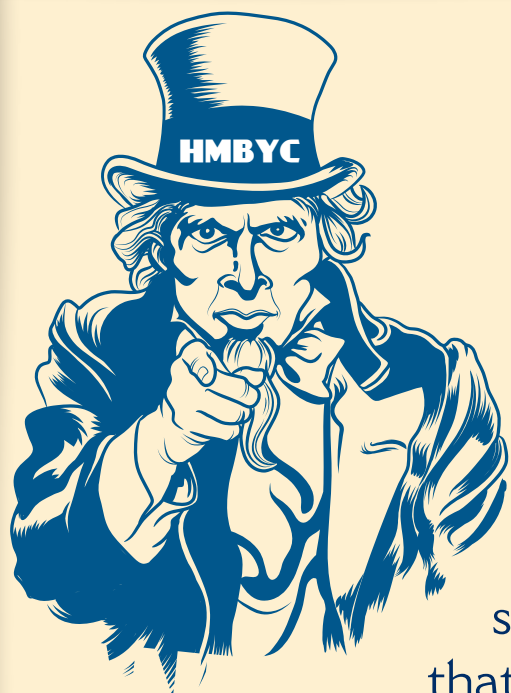

In last winter's member survey, many of you asked for ways to pay your dues via credit card and/or online—so we delivered, as was announced at the QMM. You can now pay online via the web site. You can use your credit/debit card to pay in person at the bar or anytime Lisa is in the office. And of course you can still give Lisa a paper check or even cash. With all these new ways to pay, along with the tried-and-true, there are really no obstacles remaining. If you know you're past due, please get current.

To those of you who make a point of always paying on time—and particularly to those who pre-pay an entire year's dues every January!—please accept my gratitude. Kip and I—along with the entire board—really appreciate your support. HMBYC is neither a huge organization nor a country club; we have no endowment or huge reserve. Membership dues are our lifeblood, and we are thankful for everyone who gets their dues in on time.

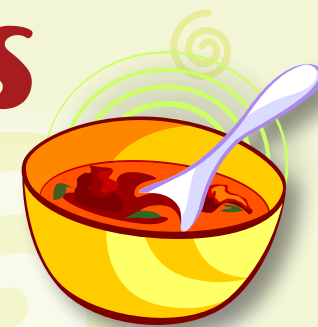

A well organized event! Bravo!!



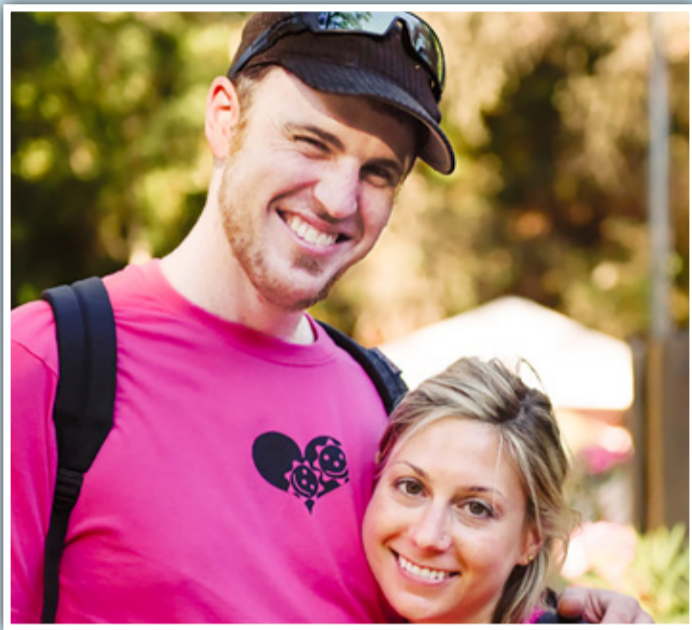
NEW MEMBERS

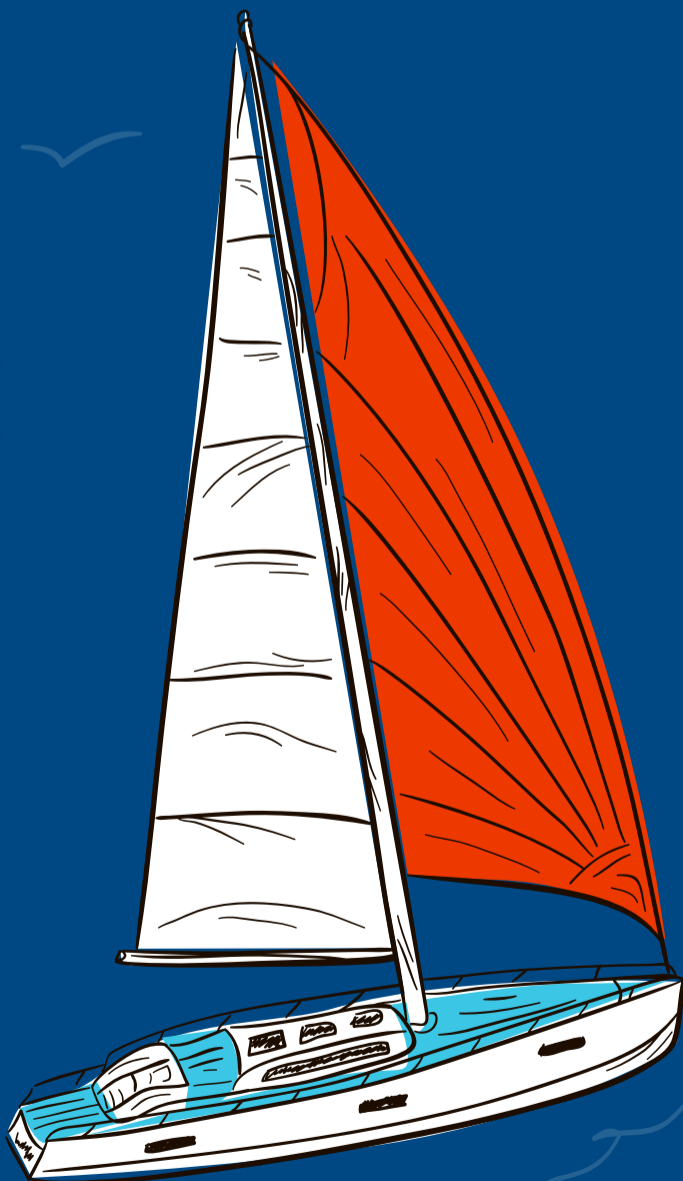

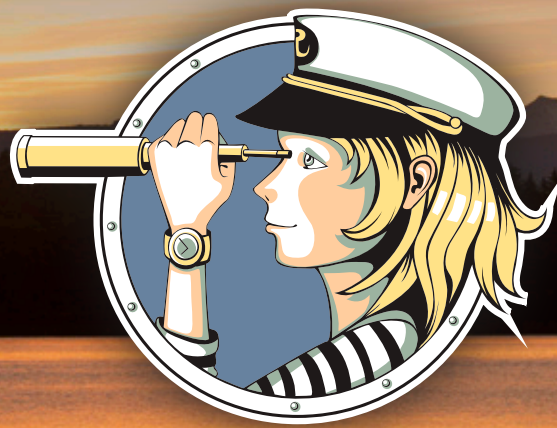


Bareboat Training in the San Juan's for Women Sailors

Coming Soon: Deck Renovation

In our recent membership survey, you let us know that replacing the deck was a priority. We listened, and are excited to announce that deck renovation will start immediately after Labor Day this summer.

Construction will take place in two phases. First, we will prep and replace the area under the lanai. Once that is complete, we will tackle the open area of the deck. During construction we will make sure that access to the clubhouse is not blocked, no worries.

But doing this within the club's budget means we need...you. Volunteers, that is. The lifeblood of HMBYC. We have always relied on member volunteers for projects such as this, and this project is no exception. Volunteer support makes the project possible without going into debt, and it's also a great way to meet new people and reconnect with old friends.

We will develop a flowchart of tasks in the next month so everyone can see how the work will proceed. We will break the job down into simple tasks, such as digging, setting new concrete piers, nailing on the rail boards, painting, etc., so that anyone who is willing to pitch in can help.

Of course, we will also need more experienced volunteers in some areas, such as framing to connect the structure into the existing buildings. If you have experience in construction, please let me know. But we plan to make the deck project as fun as possible for everyone who can pitch in, no matter if you are a beginner or an experienced contractor. Everyone will be welcome, and—trust me on this!—there will be plenty of work for everyone to do.

Come to the late-July membership meeting to see a presentation about this, and ask any questions that you have. I look forward to working with you all...and to a brand-new deck!

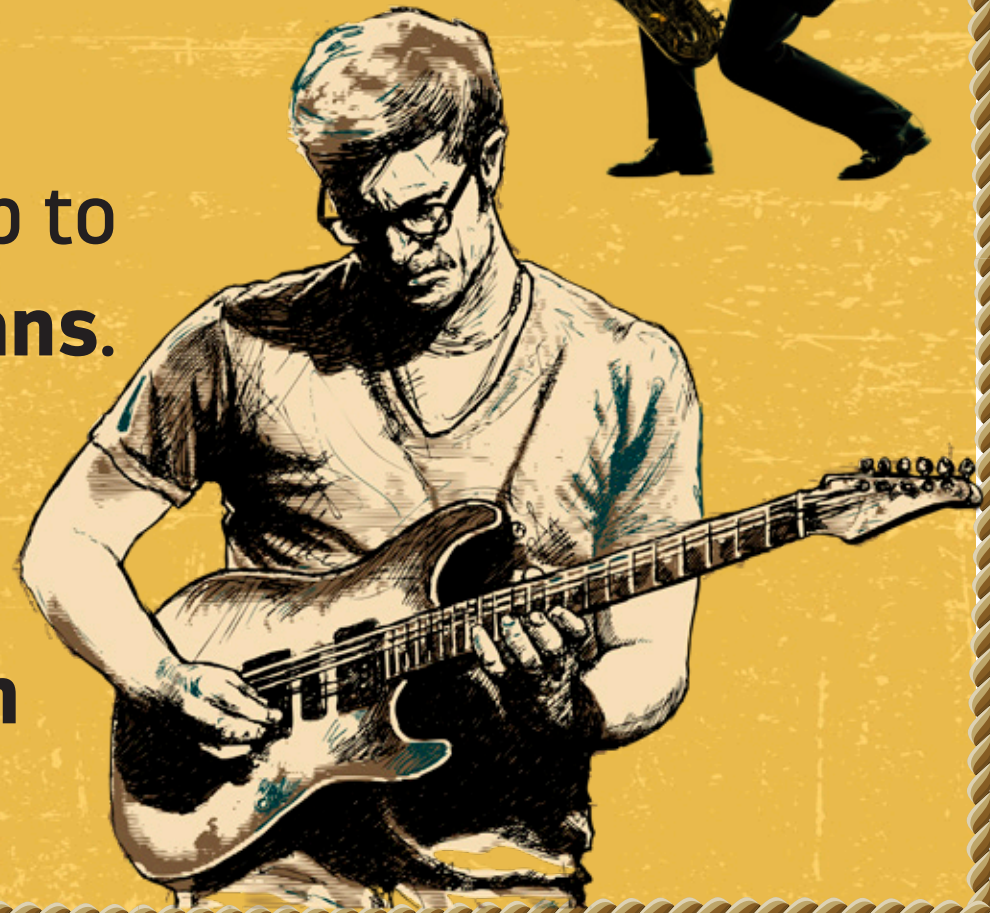

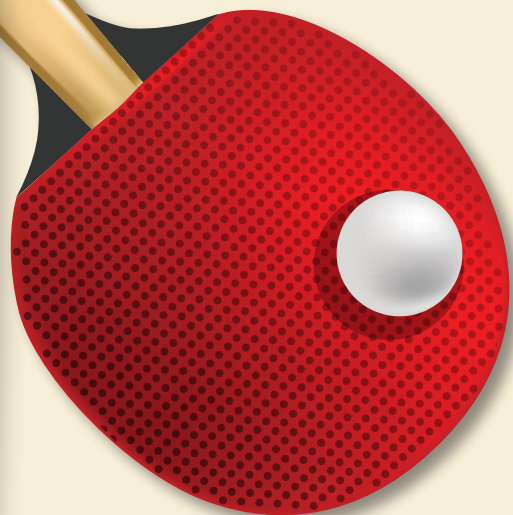
