functional responsibilities. Again, my thanks to everyone who attended, gave thought to the topic, engaged in the discussion,

and voted.

Looking back, I definitely think July earned the right to be called "jam-packed"...and looking forward, I think August looks every bit as non-doldrum-ish. See you around the club!

Terri did a great job as our on site Event Captain and everyone was very cooperative and kind about sorting out seating times and when to get upstairs to the restaurant. Thank you, Terri (and Steve)! Thank you to Spencer Nassar for organizing this wonderful Cruise Out!

While most of us were on the dock, some of us were docked at the StFYC downstairs bar, with great drinks and an incredible view. We did manage to divide ourselves into smaller separate groups for dinner, as was requested by the Clipper Ship dining room. At 6:00 PM, the first group went up to dinner. The Clipper Ship is a fantastic dining room upstairs from the bar, with an all glass panorama view of San Francisco Bay and the Golden Gate Bridge. We were in the first seating. The menu offered a California style cuisine for the most part, with the Saturday Night Special of "Surf and Turf" steak with lobster tail. A few people at our table ordered that and it looked amazing! Bernard and Vivian pointed out a footnote on the wine list — a burgee by the wines for the vineyards owned by StFYC club members. That was fun to see (maybe HMBYC should up our game).

The drinks, starters and dinner were all excellent. A few of us had dessert. At our table someone ordered a dense flourless chocolate cake, which looked incredible. We ordered the Crème brûlée, which was wonderful.

The twilight accompanied us during dinner, making for a magical, extended summer fog-free sunset. Notes from Our June 29th 2019 OYRA (Offshore Yacht Racing) Event



The HMBYC race committee launched the OYRA Half Moon Bay Race from the race deck of the Saint Francis Yacht Club to a Pillar Point Harbor finish line on Saturday, June 29.

34 boats raced in 5 divisions. The fastest boats raced a 32 nautical mile (nm) course - out to the SF Lightship before heading down the coast. The remaining boats raced a 28.5 nm course - out to R2 before heading down to Pillar Point. All boats finished outside our harbor on line between Buoy #3 and the tower at the end of the harbor entrance. All but 2 boats finished the race. All finishers arrived in an 80 minute interval.

Racers visited the club and Princeton restaurants before cruising back to San Francisco on Saturday and Sunday.


