


Do Nenow you? REMEMBER YOUR NAME

Women Sailing Winter Seminar



CHESAPEAKE CIRCUMNAVIGATION BY JIM FAIR AND LINDA POWERS

Thursday • February 27, 2020 • 7:00 pm

In February 2009 Jim Fair and Linda Powers left Berkeley to begin their circumnavigation onboard Chesapeake, the Schumacher-designed Outbound 46. In 2017, after 60,000 miles and 8.5 years, Chesapeake sailed back to Berkeley under the Golden Gate. Our trip took us to 37 countries. We traveled



down the west coast of the Americas as far south as Peru, then west by way of the Galapagos, stopping throughout the South Pacific, down to New Zealand, over the top of Australia, and into Southeast Asia. After leaving Thailand we headed south and west cross the Indian Ocean to South Africa, up the South Atlantic to Trinidad, the east coast of the U.S., back down to the Caribbean, through the Panama Canal, and then home. Our favorite spot was New Zealand where we spent 2 seasons alternating between Fiji and Vanuatu, our second most favorite spot.



Anchoring: A Boater's Right or Privilege?

Imagine you are a sailor transiting from the Pacific Northwest to Southern California. As you proceed south, the weather turns ugly. The winds steadily build, as do the seas. You need to find a safe harbor in which to wait out the storm.

San Francisco Bay would be the ideal place to drop a hook. But, if some people have their way, there would be no place in the Bay you could legally do so.

Those who oppose anchoring point out that abandoned vessels have become an alternative source of housing for the homeless, causing environmental damage and/or creating navigation hazards. Richardson Bay near Sausalito and the Alameda estuary are cited as prime examples. One public agency has taken the position that there is no such thing as a legal anchorage anywhere in the Bay.

RBOC and the larger boating community believe that such a draconian approach is unreasonable and unsafe. Centuries-old nautical tradition maintains that any vessel seeking refuge from inclement weather or in need of provisioning or repairs should be allowed to find safe haven.

The debate is complicated by who has jurisdiction over anchorages. In the case of Richardson Bay, is it Sausalito or the County? Is it the U.S. Coast Guard? Is it the State? The same kinds of questions muddy the waters up and down the California Coast.

There are funds available from the State Boating and Waterways Division for the removal of abandoned recreational vessels. Counties can apply for grants for that purpose. RBOC has lobbied for the availability of such funds and for protecting them from being used for non-boating programs.

While RBOC cannot solve the region's housing problems, we can and will work to keep restrictions on anchoring within the boundaries of reasonableness and safety.

Here in Pillar Point Harbor, we are fortunate to have policies that allow mariners to drop an anchor or tie onto a mooring inside the breakwater when the need arises. And, of course, every Labor Day weekend, we invite yachts from all over the Bay to come and enjoy HMBYC hospitality.


