Women Sailing Winter Seminar CHESAPEAKE CIRCUMNAVIGATION BY JIM FAIR AND LINDA POWERS Thursday • February 27, 2020 • 7:00 pm

In February 2009 Jim Fair and Linda Powers left Berkeley to begin their circumnavigation onboard Chesapeake, the Schumacher-designed Outbound 46. In 2017, after 60,000 miles and 8.5 years, Chesapeake sailed back to Berkeley under the Golden Gate. Our trip took us to 37 countries. We traveled



down the west coast of the Americas as far south as Peru, then west by way of the Galapagos, stopping throughout the South Pacific, down to New Zealand, over the top of Australia, and into Southeast Asia. After leaving Thailand we headed south and west cross the Indian Ocean to South Africa, up the South Atlantic to Trinidad, the east coast of the U.S., back down to the Caribbean, through the Panama Canal, and then home. Our favorite spot was New Zealand where we spent 2 seasons alternating between Fiji and Vanuatu, our second most favorite spot.



Tour of the tall ship Matthew Turner in Sausalito


On Saturday, Feb. 8, club members were treated to a special private tour of the new traditional wooden tall ship **Matthew Turner** in Sausalito. The brigantine Matthew Turner is a tall ship designed after the ship Galilee, which was built in the late 1800's by the ship designer and builder Matthew Turner. The Galilee held the San Francisco to Tahiti passage record of 19 days for many years.

We were lucky to be able to nab a tour during their current busy schedule of sea trials, and were especially lucky in our tour guide, Alan Olson, Project Director and originator of the shipbuilding project overall. Alan used his 50+ years of experience in boat construction, engineering, restoration and sailing to inform his vision of building a historic educational tall ship for San Francisco Bay. He founded the non-profit organization **Call of the Sea** in 1985 to provide hands-on, educational experiences for youth and adults aboard traditional sailing vessels.

Call of the Sea is a volunteer organization, with building teams donating their time and expertise.

RBOC's Sacramento Report:

The Silting of San Francisco Bay

In the past, when HMBYC was planning its annual schedule of "Sail-Outs," one of our favorite destinations was the harbor at Petaluma. Situated in the middle of Petaluma's downtown and within easy walking distance of many local attractions, it was an ideal place to spend a weekend.

Today, such an event would be physically impossible. The only way to get a boat from San Pablo Bay to Petaluma is the Petaluma River, which has become non-navigable to even shallow-draft vessels due to silting of the riverbed.

Petaluma is not the only place on San Francisco Bay with a silting problem. In the far south, some yacht clubs have found themselves far away from boating waters due to filling-in of what were once bays and inlets suitable for marinas and boatyards.

Up in the Delta, dredging has taken on greater urgency over the years as silting has increased. One club, the venerable Sacramento Yacht Club, had to build its own dredge which it uses to keep its waterfront marina operational.

Why the problem? Like so many other matters in government, it's complicated. First, there's the cost of dredging. It's expensive and getting more so every year...(which explains why Sacramento YC has its own dredging machine.) Second, dredging of navigable waterways has traditionally been the purview of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. With a limited budget and shortage of resources, the Corps has fallen far behind in meeting its responsibilities.

Then, there is the competition between commercial, military and recreational needs. In a funding contest between a major shipping hub, a naval operations center and a waterway used primarily for recreational purposes, you can guess who is going to end up the loser. Throw in an intimidating set of rules and regulations that criss-cross federal, state and local jurisdiction and you have the ultimate case of gridlock.

Solutions? Petaluma finally got tired of waiting for the Corps to solve its problems. The town's city council recently voted to fund dredging using local taxpayer revenues. How much will it cost? No one is sure but the tab is sure to exceed several million dollars.

Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC) is exploring a new route to finding dredging funds. At a recent meeting of the California Division of Boating and Waterways, part of the state's Parks and Recreation Department, RBOC made a plea for the Division to allocate funds from its annual budget to support urgently-needed dredging projects not only in the Bay but throughout the state where silting has become a problem.

The outcome? Too early to say. But even the stingiest budget hawks are beginning to understand what's at stake if we don't take action. RBOC will continue to advocate on behalf of the recreational boating community until government sees the light and does the right thing.


