

Slowly but Surely

Club Paddlecraft and Small Boats

This is still evolving, but for now we will be allowing **ADULT USE ONLY** of individual paddlecraft that are specifically laid out on sawhorses in the boatyard. (If parents are present and will certify compliance with disinfecting procedures, their teens may use the equipment - again, only if parents are there with them.)

- Members will need to wear full-fingered gloves at all times they use the paddlecraft.
- They will also need to use the provided spray disinfectant after using the watercraft and paddles.
- And finally, members need to being their own PFDs we do not have a way to disinfect our club PFDs.
- Event Center restrooms will be accessible from the back with your card key.

CAL20s

We measured the cockpit of a Cal20 and it looks like two people could maintain six feet of distance as long as one sits in the stern and the other close to the jib winches. People would need to choose one crew member they would feel comfortable/safe with, but since we cannot get risk to zero, this would be at your own risk. And of course one person must be a checked out skipper. Please also use the spray bottle of disinfectant to clean hard surfaces of the boat once you dock it. (There are two VHF radios in chargers inside the ferry engine tower on the floating dock.)

Summer Youth Sailing Camp

We are offering two Youth Summer camp sessions of 3 weeks each, for a maximum of 12 children per session.

Camp sessions will operate Monday through Friday from 8:30 am - 12:30 pm each day. (Our instructors feel morning camp times are better for instruction due to higher winds in the afternoons.)

Cost for Summer Camp: \$700 per session

While we will give priority for camp spots to current members, non-members may enroll their children for the same price, providing they also pay for the \$100 youth membership in the club. This will allow these children to participate in after-camp regattas and activities through the end of the year, and will apply toward a family club initiation fee should you wish to join the club afterward.

Due to the limited number of spots available for camp this summer, there will be a \$100 per child non-refundable deposit. Parents must pay at least a week in advance of the first day of camp, or your spot will be given to youths on the waiting list.

We need a minimum of 8 children in order to run camp sessions. If we don't get enough enrollments to offer a camp session, the alternative is that you can sign up for private lessons. If we cancel camp due to lack of minimum enrollments, you will receive a full refund of your payment.



Boating Industry Faces Rough Seas Ahead

Let's start this article by defining what we mean by "boating industry." It's different from you and me. We are "recreational boaters."

The boating industry is made up of boat manufacturers, yacht brokers, marina and boat yard operators, marine parts and supplies manufacturers, boating equipment

retailers and, finally, local businesses that depend on boaters.

According to figures provided by the National Marine Manufacturers Association (NMMA) the boating industry in California alone is a 13 billion dollar per year economic engine that provides over 41,000 jobs and supports over 2,800 businesses. Add maritime states on all shores across the country and you can begin to grasp the scope of the national boating industry. NMMA estimates that 141.6 million Americans go boating each year.

And yes, you can buy a boat that was manufactured in France, England, Germany, Taiwan, or some other country. But, NMMA points out that 95 percent of boats sold in the U.S. are built in the U.S.

So, the state of the boating industry matters in so many ways. For us, who love the art and science of boating, it means we have an almost endless choice of boats, sails, hardware, accessories, marine engines, electronics, safety equipment and much more. It also means that we can have our vessels serviced by reputable, expert technicians and kept in state-of-the-art marinas.

This year, the boating industry will suffer from the economic downturn in the same way as every other segment. When you read about fewer cars being sold, when you hear of lost jobs and lost revenues, when you personally feel the pain of the pandemic side effects, just remember that the boating industry is feeling the same pain.


