

## Minot Parker






### Adult Sailing Class August 15 & 16, 2020

# RECREATIONAL BOATERS OF CALIFORNIA SACRAMENTO REPORT

# Proposed Law Could Mean Trouble for Recreational Boaters

A bill currently pending in the State legislature, Assembly Bill 3030, would establish a state goal to keep at least 30% of California's land and waterways free from development and other human impacts such as climate change by the year 2030.

At first glance, it appears to be an admirable effort that is part of a nationwide movement to conserve land and waterways. Yet, a broad coalition of state boating and fishing organizations is opposing the measure.

Why?

The old saying, "The devil is in the details" comes to mind. In this case, the problem is the lack thereof. Critics feel the broad, sweeping nature of the bill could curb recreational boating and fishing because it leaves the decision to close waterways up to state and local regulators. So, that favorite river or lake you like to boat or fish on would become off-limits if a bureaucracy uses the new law to ban vessels. Similarly, if the law is applied to coastal areas, it could seriously impact public and commercial fishing in some areas.

Opponents to AB3030 have not rejected the honorable intent of the author, Assemblyman Ash Kalra (D-San Jose), but have asked for more specificity to the vague provisions of the bill. For instance, is recreational boating, whether motorized or non-motorized, exempted from the bill's restrictions? On the question of over-fishing, the CA State Fish and Wildlife Department already controls when certain species of fish can or cannot be taken by either public or commercial fishermen. Do we need an additional layer of bureaucracy on the matter?

The above-mentioned coalition sent a July 17 letter to the Senate Natural Resources Committee that states, in part: "We remain very concerned about the broad and sweeping nature of the [AB 3030] bill. Unless the extent and impacts of existing protections in ocean waters are expressly acknowledged in this legislation, unnecessary fishery closures will likely result, further restricting recreational angler opportunity and possibly setting the stage for another contentious fight around the establishment of these closures."

RBOC is among the 132 co-signers of the letter.
