

High Stakes Poker

The hottest topic in Sacramento these days is the state's recovery from the COVID pandemic. How soon, how fast, and how best managed are subjects consuming lots of time, energy and debate. The outcome of these deliberations hinge on a single and totally unpredictable factor: New cases of the virus.

If infection rates drop, remain steady, or if they spike as restrictions are lifted, the political implications are formidable. For many in the capitol, it is a poker game with the highest stakes.

For instance, whether the recall movement which seeks to oust the Governor either succeeds or fails will be largely influenced by the numbers. In turn, the prospects of elected legislators will also rise or fall depending on their positioning as pro-opening or pro-lockdown.

The uncertainty of the situation is exacerbated by conflicting indicators. Once criticized for the rapid spread of the virus, California is now held up as an example of a state that handled the matter well, or at least better than many other states. On the other hand, the damage done to the economy, particularly in the small business sector, looms large in the public consciousness.

All this results in a collective nervousness in the executive and legislative branches of state government that affects how business gets done. Without a clear path to recovery, decisions on policymaking become tentative and cloudy. Only time and epidemiological statistics will ultimately tell the tale.

While on the subject of the pandemic, it is appropriate to reflect on how HMBYC has fared during these difficult times. Many other yacht clubs have staggered under the weight of restrictions and their resulting shutdowns, while our Club has sailed through the storm relatively unscathed. A huge amount of credit for this goes to the Officers and Directors who have made the right decisions and kept the ship on an even keel.

The light at the end of the tunnel glows a little brighter each day, thanks to their skillful leadership.
