RECREATIONAL BOATERS OF CALIFORNIA SACRAMENTO REPORT

Registration Fee is Finally Resolved... and Other Updates

At long last, we can breathe a sigh of relief over what has been a prolonged struggle to avoid a whopping 250 percent increase in the fee boaters must pay to renew their vessel registration. A boating coalition, led by RBOC, was successful in lobbying against the increase. So successful, in fact, that there will be no increase at all this year. None. Zero. Zip.

However, the operative words here are "this year." A condition of the decision is that a public stakeholder process will be initiated by the Division of Boating and Waterways to develop long-term solutions to financial shortfalls which led to the proposed fee increase. When that process gets underway, one of the items sure to be on the table will be vessel registration fees. Don't be surprised if we see new measures that would result in fee increases.

Needless to say, RBOC will be at the table advocating on behalf of recreational boaters statewide.

In other news, Assembly Bill 591 was signed into law which allows law enforcement officers to issue "fix it" tickets to boaters who may not have all required safety equipment on board. Instead of being charged with a misdemeanor violation, the boater receives a written notice in which the violator promises to correct the problem. The bill was supported by RBOC and the California State Sheriffs Association.

Also, RBOC-supported AB 335 has moved to the Senate floor with the expectation that it will pass. The bill creates an exemption from the state's Consumer Privacy Act that allows sharing of vessel owner information for the sole purpose of recalls, warranties and repairs. The result is that boaters can be notified if their vessel is the subject of a recall action for replacement or repair of manufacturing flaws.

As the legislative year winds down to a recess in September, there will probably be last-minute attempts to expedite or delay passage of other bills still in the pipeline. RBOC will continue to closely monitor developments in the Assembly and Senate throughout the period and again when the Legislature reconvenes in January. Also, regulatory actions in the Executive Branch as well as at the regional, county and local levels will be watched and, where necessary, acted upon for the remainder of the calendar year and beyond.
