FROM THE HELM

It has been an exciting ride during my first two month at the helm, and the forecast is for no change.

HMBYC Flotiila Returns from Conquering the BVI

All those faces you've missed seeing over the holidays have safely returned from a very happy sojourn in the British Virgin Islands. Under the capable leadership of Flotilla Captain Michael Day, seven ships set sail from Road Town, Tortola and took in harbors on Jost Van Dyke, Norman Island, Peter Island, Virgin Gorda, and at least two intrepid boats bounded off to Anegada, a coral reef island north of Virgin Gorda, to do some scuba diving and exploring. Weather was fabulous (despite a couple of howling storms and a few days of 25-32 knot gusty winds) and the sailing in non-hypothermic waters was wonderful. Restaurants on several different islands loved hearing Michael on VHF 16 making reservations for '42 for dinner at 7, please.'
